## Message from our Executive Director

This fiscal year was one of growth and opportunities for Bo's Place. We enhanced our programs and expanded our reach in new and innovative ways including:

- Partnering with photographer Karen Sachar to develop and produce a traveling photography exhibit entitled "Life and Death...Let's Talk About It" to increase awareness of the needs of grieving children and families and to educate about ways in which each of us can support the bereaved in our community;
- Piloting our first offsite support group in West Houston/Katy in September 2014 (which was full to capacity on opening day);
- Hiring a second bilingual clinician to support our Spanish Outreach efforts – targeting the East End and Gulfton areas;

We continue to provide grief support to children, families and adults in a variety of ways – meeting the needs of those seeking support in the manner that best works for them:

- 963 individuals participated in grief support groups (499 children/464 adults) facilitated by 197 trained volunteer facilitators;
- 260 individuals in grief support groups identify as Hispanic and 71 of those individuals received services in the Spanish language;
- 1516 individuals sought information, referrals and consultations from and with Bo's Place mental health professionals via the information and referral line (our two bilingual clinicians provided support for all Spanish-language calls);
- Bo's Place mental health professionals provided 194 community trainings on grief and bereavement for those who work with the bereaved reaching over 1500 individuals.
- 96 family members attended Camp Healing Hearts in March 2014, our weekend bereavement camp for families enrolled in grief support groups.

Each year we strive to make our services accessible to more children, families and adults and think creatively about how we can better serve those who are struggling with their grief. This past year our Board of Directors undertook a year-long strategic planning process the resulted in a 5 year strategic plan designed to continue to extend our reach and enhance our offerings through:

- Additional targeted offsite locations for grief support groups;
- Deeper reach into the Hispanic community;
- Increased access to grief and bereavement support utilizing the web and social media;
- Additional camp/retreat opportunities (i.e. Spanish-language camp, fall camp, Mother's Retreat);
- Development and pilot of a school-based support group program for underserved children who can't access our existing Bo's Place family support groups.

There are many, many generous donors that make our programs and plans for expansion possible, donors like the Hamill Foundation and the New York Life Foundation. In addition to our grant efforts, special events also help ensure there are sufficient funds to continue to provide our grief support services free of charge to those in need. This year, we partnered for the first time with Debbie and Rudy Festari and Festari for Men as the beneficiary of their Una Notte in Italia Men's Fashion Show and Italian dinner, exceeding all expectations and netting over \$270,000. Our annual Hearts of Hope Luncheon also raised a record \$329,000 for our programs. To all our donors and supporters, you have our gratitude.

Together, we provide a community of people helping people through one of the most challenging of life's experiences, the death of a loved one. Thank you for being part of the Bo's Place community.

## Mission

Bo's Place exists to enhance the lives of those who have experienced the death of a loved one.

## Programs

**Bo's Place Grief Support Groups** - Although every loss is different and uniquely personal, the reactions to death and resulting grief often share the common characteristic of leaving people feeling alone and isolated by their sadness. Grief Support Groups offer children, youth and adults a place to validate their experience and, in doing so, a sense of comfort that they are not alone in their emotional struggles.

Bo's Place Family Support Groups follow a structured, yet flexible curriculum with separate, developmentally appropriate groups for each family member. Children gather in groups divided by age, and, when numbers allow, are further divided by similarities in the type of death experienced. This is important in that grief work differs according to a child's chronological and developmental age as well as their relationship to the deceased. The adult family members meet to process their own emotions and also to learn tools to best support their grieving children.

- LIGHT (Looking Inward, Grieving & Healing Together) Group: For children, ages 5-18, and their families, who have experienced the sudden and unexpected death of a parent or have experienced the death of a child/sibling; meet weekly for nine weeks; families completing a LIGHT Group may transfer to an ongoing group.
- Ongoing Family Groups: For children, ages 5-18, and their families, who have completed LIGHT or for those who have experienced an anticipated death of a parent; meet twice a month; families may participate for as long as they feel it is helpful as they progress on their grief journey.
- Spanish-language Family Groups: For children, and their families, and for adults; available at Bo's Place as well as at limited offsite locations.
- Little Friends Groups: For preschool children, ages 3 and 4, who have experienced a death in their immediate family; children attend weekly for eight weeks with a parent or guardian.



Adult groups are available to those who have experienced the death of a significant person in his or her life, whether child, parent, grandchild, spouse, partner, relative or friend.

- Adult Groups: For men and women ages 30 and older; meet weekly for nine weeks.

- Young Adult Groups: For men and women ages 18 to 30; meet weekly for nine weeks.

Bo's Place also offers Pregnancy Loss Groups for women who have experienced the perinatal death of a child or children.

- Pregnancy Loss Groups: Meet weekly for eight weeks.



Other special grief support programs such as family night, scrapbooking, parents' night out, summer fun days for children and a weekend bereavement camp/retreat are offered to participants in Bo's Place grief support groups.

**Information and Referral Line** - The Information and Referral Line at Bo's Place offers a compassionate ear for those who seek information about the grief process, about Bo's Place grief programs, or about other community grief support resources. Clinicians answer calls and inquiries from those who have experienced a death, as well as from family, friends, co-workers or other concerned individuals who want guidance as to how to support the bereaved.

**Community Education and Training** - Bo's Place offers opportunities for professionals and volunteers working to support those in grief. Workshops and trainings, conducted by clinical staff and/or field experts, can be customized for a variety of audiences including: medical and social service professionals, school personnel, faith-based communities and community organizations and volunteer groups.

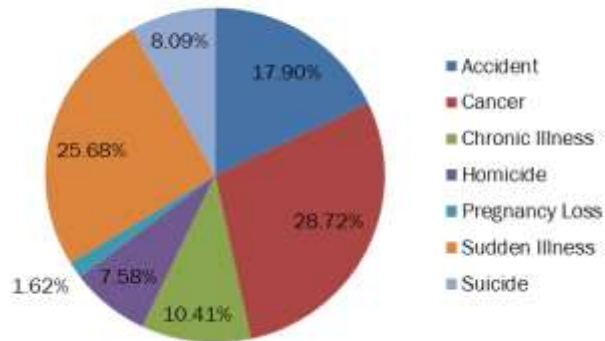
Bo's Place training programs seek to increase understanding of the grief process and to offer guidance about how to support the bereaved. Offerings range from short presentations about Bo's Place grief support to full-day continuing education workshops for professionals.



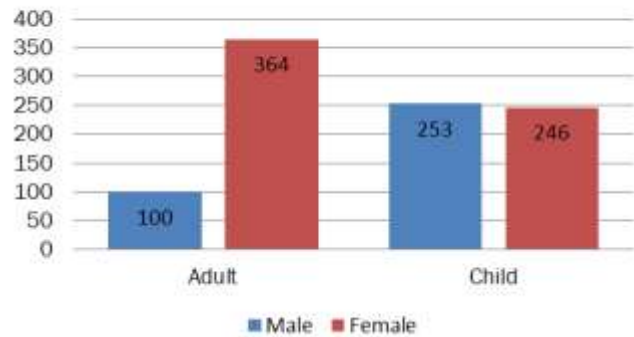

Bo's Place Grief Support Groups comprised of: 320 Families (963 individuals – 499 children/464 adults)

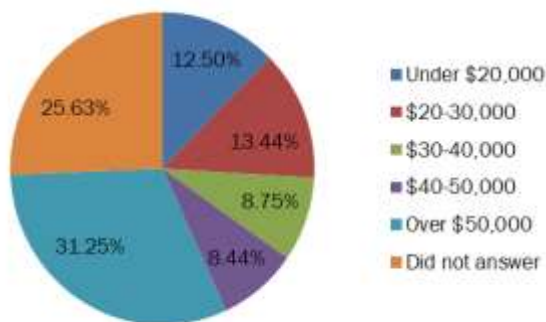
### Cause of Death



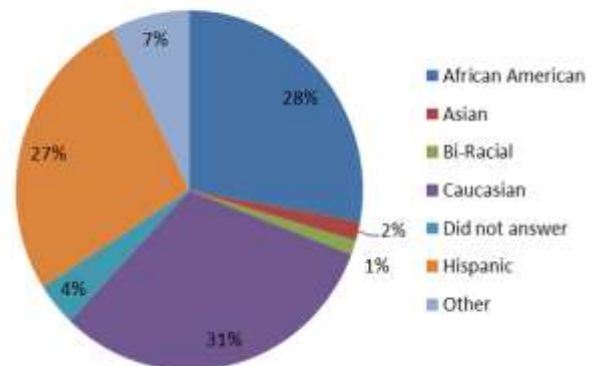
### Gender

## Program Impacts

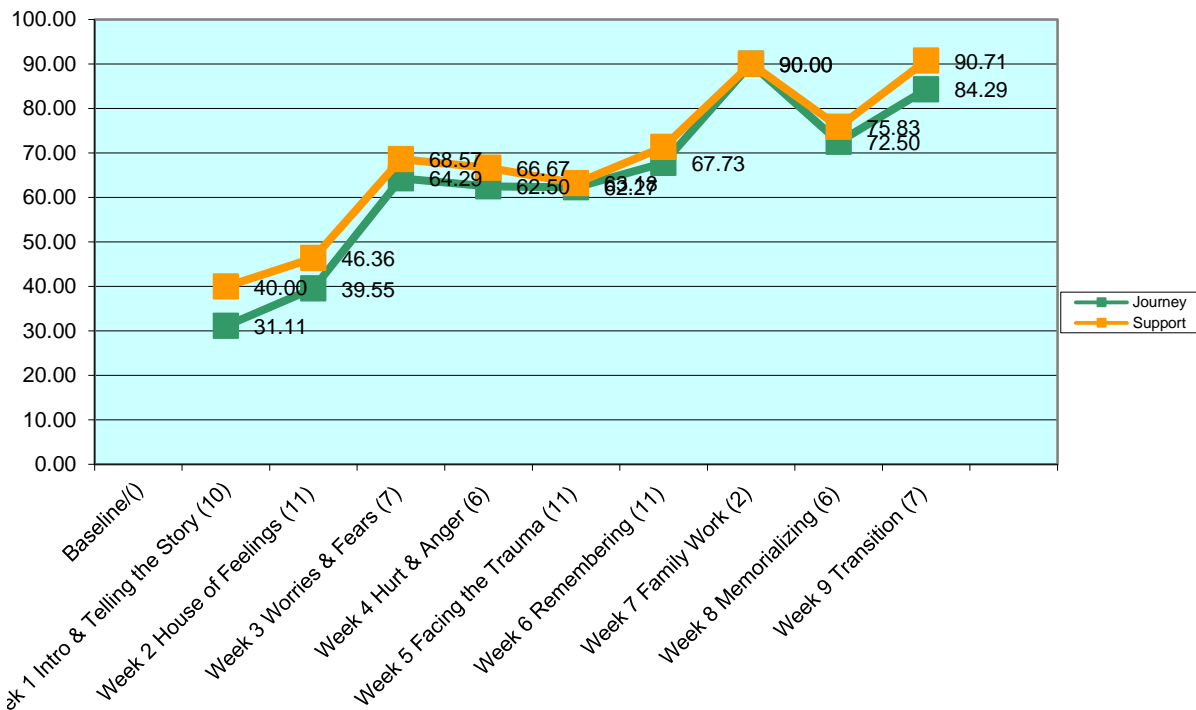
Bo's Place licensed mental health staff assesses program impact by collecting data from adult participants. There is not a standardized measurement tool in the bereavement field to track movement or progress through the grief journey. Bo's Place uses two methods of collecting outcome data: a Satisfaction Survey and a Progress of Grief Journey Survey (POGJ).

The Parent/Participant Satisfaction Survey measures the perception of parents/adult participants as to the effect individual components of the program have on the child/adult participant's progress on the grief journey.

The Progress of Grief Journey Survey (POGJ) was developed by a PhD candidate as part of her dissertation for the Graduate School of Social Work at The University of Houston. It measures a participant's perception of where they are on their grief journey over time and compares that measurement with their perception of the support their grief support group has provided them over the same period of time. Below is a sample POGJ for the March 27-May 22, 2014 round of LIGHT.

The Satisfaction Surveys collected continue to demonstrate forward progress on individual grief journeys among participants in Bo's Place grief support group programs. POGJ results, to date, indicate a strong correlation between support received at Bo's Place and positive progress on the grief journey. For the past four years, the average time that a family remains in an Ongoing Grief Support Group is 14 – 15 months.

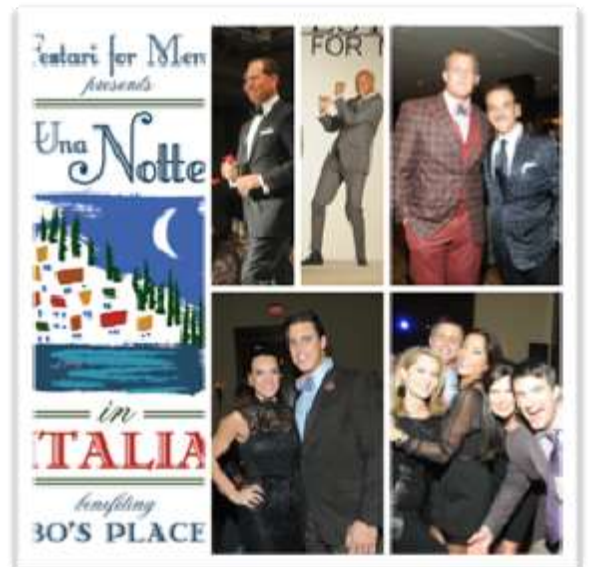
### Hearts of Hope

The 2014 Hearts of Hope Luncheon, co-chaired by Jennifer O'Donnell and Cristina O'Shell, netted nearly \$329,000 due to the generous support of over 760 friends of Bo's Place. The luncheon was held on Thursday, February 6, 2014 in the ballroom of The Westin Galleria Hotel. Everyone enjoyed the very personal story that speaker Cheryl Strayed, author of *Wild*, shared about her unique grief experience and was moved by "Life and Death...Let's Talk About It", a touching video featuring bereaved families who have found hope and healing at Bo's Place. In addition, Robin Bush Award Honoree Dorothy Ables inspired with a message about the rewards of volunteering and the potential our efforts have to make a real difference for families in our community.

### Una Notte in Italia

Co-chaired by Diane Caplan and Megan Sutton-Reed, Festari for Men's Una Notte in Italia benefiting Bo's Place netted over \$270,000 for Bo's Place programs. In addition to the fashion show, the sold out crowd enjoyed an evening at the Omni Houston Hotel filled

with fine Italian dining, wine, dancing and a live auction.



### Marathon

Bo's Place was selected for the ninth year to be a Run for a Reason Charity for the Chevron Houston Marathon. This year we saw an increase in participation, not only from board members and the community, but also from families participating in Bo's Place programs. We are looking forward to growing Team Bo's Place in 2015.
