Developing Grief Support Programs for Spanish Speaking Families

Flor Guebara, Spanish Outreach Manager, and Cristina Flores, Bilingual Ongoing Groups Manager, are on a mission to enhance and expand programming offered to Hispanic/Latino families who come to Bo's Place for grief support services.

In addition to modifying the times and places we offer Spanish-language support groups based upon feedback from the families attending our groups, they helped launch a school-based support group program targeting Hispanic/Latino children who face challenges getting to Bo's Place family support groups. They also ran our first Camp Healing Hearts (Retiro Sanando Corazones) in Spanish and have planned a iFiesta en Bo's Place! to mirror our annual summer Family Fun Night.



Flor and Cristina presented a workshop on **A Bo's Place Grief Support Group Program for Spanish-speaking Children, Families, and Adults** at this year's National Alliance for Grieving Children Symposium held in Portland, OR. In their presentation, they openly shared the opportunities and challenges they have faced in their work. During the Q&A portion of the workshop, attendees expressed a desire to find a way to continue the dialogue. Flor and Cristina communicated this suggestion to the NAGC staff who initiated a monthly Spanish-speaking Programming Forum to be facilitated by Flor and Cristina. Thirty-three NAGC members have signed up to participate in the monthly

In their work with our Spanish-speaking families, Flor and Cristina have recognized the challenges faced by volunteer facilitators and clinicians in finding the most appropriate Spanish words to use in discussing issues/themes related to grief and bereavement. They are working on Grief 101 - Los Basicos del Duelo to offer as a workshop for Spanish-speaking volunteers and clinicians in Spring 2016. The workshop will be provided en Español!
